Can all glass be recycled?

No, not all types of glass can be recycled. You should check with your local council. Here is a quick list of what can and cannot be recycled.

How can you help?

You can help care for the environment by recycling glass. It's easy to do and it will reduce landfill space, air pollution and minimise green house gases. Simply place all your empty glass jars (with the lids removed) in the recycling bin every fortnight and encourage your family and friends to do this as well!
